Thanksgiving Opportunity: Baskets of Blessings, New This Year

Innocent people can be unfairly hurt when someone in their family makes a serious mistake. That's why East Bay Chaplains contacted the Great Commission Team to ask FPCC to collect food for Thanksgiving for families of some prison convicts. We are hoping that everyone in our church can help make Thanksgiving a special day for the three or four families that we have been assigned. There will be sign-ups in the Fellowship Hall the first two Sundays in November. We are asking each person/family in the congregation to donate at least one item; you may donate more if you wish. We encourage you to work together with a group you may belong to – Sunday School class, Bible Study Group or group of friends. You will not need to prepare or serve the donated food; it will be collected November 19th, the Sunday before Thanksgiving, and delivered by volunteers. (PDA). We have offered PDA as an option for the many disasters that have touched people's hearts during the year. It enables congregations and mission partners of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to witness to the healing love of Christ through caring for communities adversely affected by crises and catastrophic events.

PDA:

- focuses on the long term recovery of disaster-impacted communities.
- works collaboratively with church partners and members of the ACT Alliance (Action by Churches Together) internationally, and nationally with other faith-based responders.
- connects partners locally and internationally with key organizations active in the response – United Nations, NVOAD (National Voluntary Agencies Active in Disaster), World Food Program, Red Cross, FEMA and others.
