A New Outreach Team: "HPT Plus"



"HPT Plus"? What does that mean...? Who does it serve?

So glad you asked!

HPT stands for Heritage Plaza Towers, the two residential buildings that are our neighbors across the street on Pacheco and Grant Streets. We have about a dozen members and regular attendees who live in those apartments.

We have found that many residents of HPT have needs that we, as a church, can address. For example, most residents live alone and need opportunities to gather with other people and socialize. So, as you know, we threw a Sock Hop last May! We also host breakfasts and dinners, where we can meet their needs and also get to know them better and develop close relationships.

We have also found that some residents are "food insecure" – that is, they do not have continuously reliable food sources. This is another reason we offer food-inspired gatherings.

You may also have seen unfamiliar faces serving or cleaning up after one of our food events. These are volunteers from HPT who want to thank us for our generosity by giving back to us. We have also helped them with their own parties.

We created this HPT Plus team to continue finding ways to connect with those who are alone, either at the Heritage Plaza Towers or in other places in our immediate neighborhood. This includes the seniors in the Tuesday Adult Activities group. This is the "plus."

Highlights of the Summer

In June the Session approved a 6-month extension to Rev. Dr. Carol Antablin Miles' Interim Pastor Contract with First Presbyterian Church of Concord; M/P

In August CLP Darryl McCollum, working with the Property Management Team, presented a new fee schedule for weddings and memorials. The recommendations were approved.

CLP Darryl reported that much progress has been made on updating FPCC's website. It may be ready to "go live" soon.

The Session approved the Finance Team's request to pay \$19,077.16 for repairs to the PCC air conditioning from the Rider Bequest Fund.

The Outreach Team reports that it canceled the contract with Church Candy, which was providing support for Facebook use. Our social media staff feels that it learned a lot but no longer needs help. In addition, it is now utilizing TikTok, Spotify, and other social media platforms.

The Outreach Team also reported that it participated in "Thursday Night in the Park" at Todos Santos Park and plans to continue participating in the future.
